

An applicant must have judged, within five (5) years immediately preceding the submission of the application, a minimum of six (6) approved events which may include all-breed or specialty sanction matches, all-breed or specialty sweepstakes or Baby Puppy competitions, specialty futurities or maturities. A minimum total of one hundred and fifty (150) dogs must be judged; seventy-five (75) of the one hundred and fifty (150) entries may be from out of country assignments at clubs associated with a CKC-recognized kennel club. This must include a minimum of at least two (2) sanction matches.

The applicant must have a minimum of sixty (60) hours of stewarding at Canadian Kennel Club approved conformation shows. Each ring stewarding assignment must be the duration of the judge's assignment for that day and must be aminimum of four (4) hours in order to count. The stewarding must be done within the five (5) years immediately preceding the application.


- Judges and applicants must comply with the By-laws, rules and policies established by the Board of Directors of The Canadian . Kennel Club and all rules and policies of the event(s) they judge.
- Judges and applicants must be known for their honesty, integrity, impartiality, and knowledge of the sport and of the breeds they . judge or apply to judge.
- Judges are highly regarded within the fancy. When accepting assignments, whether domestic or foreign, judges act as • ambassadors of The Canadian Kennel Club, its judges, and the fancy. Their comportment must reflect their respected position and their actions must be beyond reproach.
- Judges must recognize that education is an integral part of judging and must undertake a self-directed program of continued . education.
- Judges must remain current of all pertinent rules, policies and standards relative to the event(s) and breeds they judge. .
- Judges must impartially evaluate each dog they judge and award each animal the appropriate placing relative to the event's • standard and the competition in the class, regardless of the dog's record, advertisement, friendship, or any other considerations.
- Judges must treat all exhibitors with courtesy, respect, dignity, and impartiality.
- Judges should be aware that, even when not actually engaged in judging, their comportment must reflect their position within the sport of dogs.

Mentor (Mentor: an experienced and trusted adviser)

An applicant must be mentored by a Canadian Kennel Club judge who is licensed for all breeds. The applicant's name and breeds applied for will be published for comment. Judges cannot mentor more than 2 initial applicants each calendar year.
